



## GPI POLICY - COMMUNITY SHARE OUT

All goods donated to the Pitcairn Island Community will be shared, according to the following guidelines.

### **Definitions:**

Goods – all donated perishable and non-perishable food items, merchandise and other items required to be shared out to the Community.

### **Eligibility for Share Outs – Vessel Types:**

#### Cruise ships, Freighters and the GPI Charter Vessel

If they are on-island at the time the donation, Pitcairn Islanders who are normally resident and those residing under a settlement visa are entitled to a share of donated goods from Cruise ships, Freighters and the GPI Charter Vessel.

#### GPI Charter Vessel

If they are on-island at the time of the donation, GPI Contracted staff, who are long term visitors, are entitled to a share of donated goods from the GPI Charter Vessel.

### **Share Out Procedures:**

The Mayor or a delegated member of Council is responsible for coordinating share-outs.

All donated goods are to be shared out as soon as possible.

All donate goods, which may be of use to the entire community, are to be held in an accessible communal area.

All donated books, movies, music, software, gaming and the like are to be placed in the Pitcairn Island Library unless otherwise directed by the Mayor, in consultation with Council.

Any small quantities of food items that would be difficult to share out to an entire community can be put aside at the discretion of the Mayor, in consultation with Council, to be used for the next public meal.

Donated goods may be out of date. Consumption of foods which are passed their use-by date is at the recipients own risk.

### **Activities:**

Produce a list of persons who are eligible at the time for a share out and the quantities required.

Goods are placed in individual lots based on the number of persons eligible.

Person's names are called out randomly and are allocated the relevant share out lot.

A call for collection is made on the Radio.
